

Gilbertson Takes Over Erb Bus Service

Since 1987, Erb Rural Bus Service has served the Chetek community and the Chetek-Weyerhaeuser Area School District, providing students with transportation to and from school, on field trips, extra-curricular activities and athletic events. Now after 36 years, the torch is being passed on to Gilbertson Transit with Nikki Gilbertson and Sam Motzer.

John and Vicki Erb started the bus service with regular morning and afternoon routes, one special needs route, activity buses and extra-curricular activities. Over the years, routes and trips were added to accommodate Bright Beginners students, NorthStar Academy students, extra-curricular activities and additional special needs students. Of course, when Chetek and Weverhaesuer consolidated, this added even more miles. more buses and more drivers.

"We were quite clueless starting out, but people were kind and we grew with the business," remembers Vicki Erb.



"I have John to thank for that," reminisces Vicki of her late husband, who passed away in 2021. "He hired good people. And they truly have become a family. As I've had to be at the garage more these past two years, I've grown to love each one of them and see exactly what he saw in them. The drivers, as well as other employees, have gone way above and beyond."

Vicki specifically gave special credit to the dispatcher, Rachel Robinson, and her friend Dan Boese.

"Rachel is way more than a dispatcher and has filled gaps as they've occurred in quite amazing ways," says Erb. "She's little, but she's mighty!! Dan stepped up and filled in wherever we needed him over and over again. We are especially grateful for these two. I'm not sure we could have functioned the past two years without them."

Starting Friday, Sept. 15, Erb Rural Bus Service officially became part of Gilbertson Transit of Ladysmith. At the helm is Nikki Gilbertson and Sam Motzer. Gilbertson comes with transportation in her blood. Her parents began contracting for the Lake Holcombe School District in 1988, and even from just being days old, she grew up learning the ins and outs of the transportation business. After high school she went on to get a degree in human resources. Needing some managerial experience upon graduating college,






CWHS Drama Club Amazes with Little Women

she moved back to Holcombe to manage her parents' multiple businesses in 2014.

It wasn't long after that the Ladysmith School District was looking for a new bus contractor. They approached Gilbertson Transit about the opportunity and in 2015 they started contracting with Ladysmith. Wanting to branch out on her own, her parents sold her the Ladysmith bus contract and fleet in 2016. When Sam Motzer came into the picture in 2019, they had the opportunity to expand the business in Ladysmith and purchased a new shop and four additional routes. Now they are expanding to the CW District. Sam is a life-long Chetek resident and Nikki moved to Chetek in 2018. They have two children, Olive (3) and Reagan (2-½ months)--in addition to their dogs and cat!

"Sam and I want to make this as smooth as possible as we transition from Erb to Gilbertson Transit," says Gilbertson. "We are in the works of keeping the same phone numbers. Rachel Robinson will still be the dispatcher and will be taking the phone calls like she did in the past."

Gilbertson adds that the main change people will see will be the name of the business. Families might see some new faces driving, but most of the past drivers will continue their employment with Gilbertson Transit.

"We're just very grateful," adds Motzer.

"Vicki and John have made this business what it is today," expands Gilbertson. "It has grown three to four times what they started with. I'm impressed with how many routes are coming in and out of the garage and the employees behind the scenes making sure everything flows smoothly. Bus, vans, and cars are coming and going every day. Rachel and Vicki do an amazing job scheduling and making sure every route and trip is always covered. Vicki has an amazing group of employees that we are thankful for who will be coming on board. Sam and I hope to continue the reputation Erb Bus has carried for the past 30 years."

Vicki, Sam, Nikki and Rachel have worked together on a regular basis since early August as the transition began to take place. Vicki notes she'll still be available for whatever Sam and Nikki need in the near future and says the three have developed a good relationship, adding that Sam and Nikki have been very gracious in inviting her to be down at the bus garage as much as she wants.

As the time winds down to the official sale, Vicki does get a bit emotional thinking about the past 36 years and a bittersweet transition. Ultimately, it's knowing that the community's students will still be cared for, that makes the transition just a bit better.

"Erb Rural Bus Service, and John and Vicki Erb, have been an integral part of the Chetek and Chetek-Weyerhaeuser family for so many years," notes district administrator Mark Johnson. "Our gratitude for their service and their dedication to our students is immeasurable. As we transition to working with Gilbertson Transit, we know that Nikki and Sam will continue to offer the same devotion to our students and community as John and Vicki did for so many decades. We look forward to that partnership."

"It has been such a privilege to serve the Chetek/Sand Creek/Weyerhaeuser communities for 36 years," concludes Erb. "Prior to John's passing, I hadn't worked as directly with school staff. These past two years I've gotten to know them better, and I can tell you I couldn't have asked for better people to work with during that time. Mark Johnson and the administration at CW are beyond gracious and helpful. There's so much I'll miss, especially the people. I have very mixed feelings as I step away, but your kids are in good hands. That makes it easier."

CWHS Hosts SkillsUSA Conference


